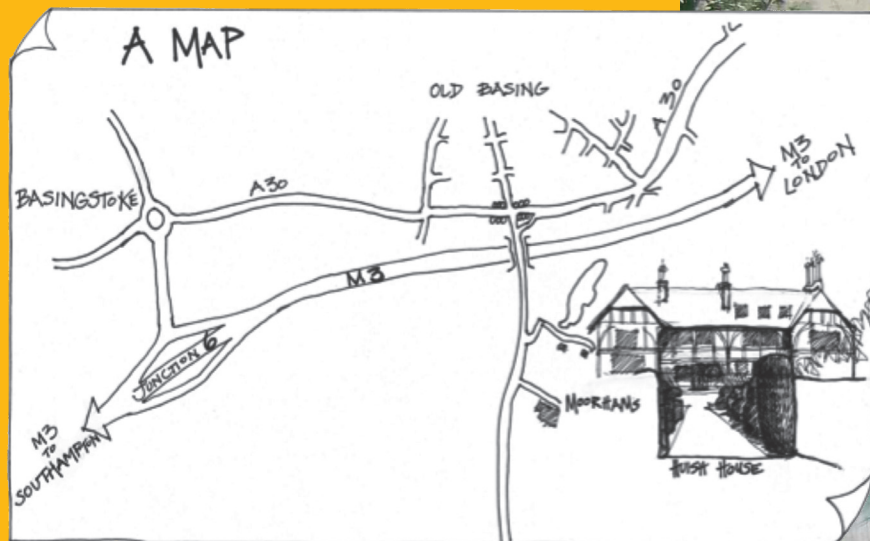

This is a momentous year for The Hackwood Art Festival. To mark its fifth Anniversary, the Festival has now formed a registered charity "Hackwood Arts Trust", to ensure that it will remain a permanent feature of the Hampshire Art Scene. This will also mean that the Festival will be able to do more each year to help local artists to develop their careers and give people in North Hampshire a better opportunity to access the visual arts.

We are at the new and spectacular Arts & Crafts Location of Huish House, by kind permission of Mr & Mrs Nigel McNair Scott.

Please note that there are areas of open water at Huish and young children must be supervised at all times.

Learn how to make paper from recycled papers – sheet forming with addition of other materials and laminating.

"The Willow Wall of Wonder" with Karen Hawkins (Join in at any time)

Create a crazy array of brilliant creations over 2 days of workshops with Kaz. She will use different materials and techniques across the two days to help you build a wall of wonders from your works.

Sculpture with Hylton Stockwell

Participants will experience one of the oldest and most direct forms of sculpture making, employed widely during the Renaissance. Modeling directly with casting wax is a technique regularly used by Hylton in his figurative studies.

Bring a photo of your pet or an animal that you like.

Drawing on Hylton's own work, participants will be encouraged to create small animal and sculptures, focusing on stance and attitude rather than detail.

12.00 - 13.30	Mythical Beasts	12	Adult*

Participants will invent their own fantasy creatures in wax using a game favoured by the surrealists 'exquisite corpse' where the body parts of different animals are reassembled to form new and unlikely forms.

14.00 - 15.30	Drop-in session	12	All ages

Take the opportunity to experiment with all the materials provided and create what you like.

There is a minimum age of 14 for adult workshops.
